



Civil Rights

- The USDA prohibits discrimination against its customers.
- Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 provide that "No person in the United State shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or active receiving Federal financial assistance."
- Therefore, programs and activities that receive Federal financial assistance must operate in a non-discriminatory manner. Also, a recipient of RMA funding may not retaliate against any person because he or she opposed an unlawful practice or policy, or made charges, testified or participated in a complaint under Title VI.

What can we do?
